BUDGET SUMMARY 2021-2022

Following bold and open conversations with our community, Council has today announced its new Corporate Plan and 2021-2022 Budget.

As in all years, this budget is one that is a challenge to balance, with many projects not able to be funded. This is a responsible budget, one based on providing a sustainable level of essential services to the community and getting the basics right.

In each and every budgetary decision we need to take into account the aspirations of our community while ensuring we meet our legislative accountabilities, our commitments to maintain our \$1.1 billion of assets and our financial sustainability for the long-term.

Leading our region through these constant challenges is a significant responsibility and not one this Council takes lightly. We recognise that every cent of Councils funds must represent an investment in a sustainable future for generations.

This budget reduces our operating deficit by \$2 million compared to last year, with general rates only being increased by 3% in line with most of the Council's across the state.

The community have spoken and we have listened. We need to run Council like a business, within the parameters we are given. We refuse to stick our heads in the sand and accept a deficit position into the future, we will work hard to balance the budget.

As Councillors, we have made these decisions as ratepayers ourselves, knowing that any decision we make affects not just our community and constituents, but our friends, our families, and the future for our children.


