

APPLICATION FOR A PERMIT TO KEEP MORE THAN THE ALLOWED NUMBER OF DOGS OR CATS

North Burnett Regional Council Subordinate Local Law No.2 (Animal Management) 2011

An authorised permit is required to keep:

- More than 2 dogs over the age of 3 months on an allotment with an area between 451m² and 4,000m² (maximum 3 dogs);
- More than 1 dog over the age of 3 months on an allotment with an area less than 450m² (maximum 2 dogs); and
- More than 2 cats over the age of 3 months on any property (maximum 3).

Permit Conditions

1. This approval may be withdrawn at any time if Council receives a valid complaint regarding the animals;
2. The animal owner must contact Council if any details of the animals change or the number of the animals within seven (7) days;
3. All dogs are to be registered annually with the North Burnett Regional Council (cats not compulsory) and applicable fees are to be paid in conjunction with the North Burnett Regional Council fees and charges schedule;
4. Animals cannot be interchanged without prior approval from the North Burnett Regional Council. I.e. Dog 1 cannot be replaced in the event it is deceased or no longer in your care without a renewed permit;
5. The area which the animals are kept is to be clean and free from accumulated faeces so that odour nuisance and/or fly breeding cannot occur;
6. You are to keep and house the dogs so as not to cause a nuisance or annoy your neighbours (nuisance includes excessive barking or noise);
7. The dogs / cats are to be kept within the confines of your property at all times; and
8. Gate to enclosure must be self locking.

Written signed confirmation required from all of your immediate neighbours to support your application. Your application will NOT be assessed without this required information.

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Requirement for proper enclosures

- 1) The enclosure-
 - a) Must be suitably fenced
 - b) Must be of a size appropriate to the species and breed of the animal
 - c) May be constructed such that parts of a building or structure can form part of the enclosure in lieu of fencing, provided the building or structure does not have openings through which the animal can escape
 - d) Must contain adequate shelter
- 2) The enclosures gates must be closed and latched except when in actual immediate use
- 3) Suitably fenced means a fence constructed of strong materials and designed in such a way to prevent the animal from-
 - a) Escaping over, under, through or around the fence
 - b) Protruding over, under, through or around the fence
 - c) Threatening to attack a person or animal over, under, through or around the fence
 - d) Attacking a person or animal over, under, through or around the fence.
- 4) Keeping an animal on a leash, cord, rope, wire or chain does not constitute a proper enclosure
