SPECIAL SHOW REGULATIONS & BY LAWS

- 1. The Show will be open to the public on Friday 21, Saturday 22 & Sunday 23 of April 2023.
- 2. Judging: All classes, unless otherwise stated, will commence at 10.00am on Saturday
- 3. Spectators May use All Official Gates.
 Trade Displays and Exhibitors Please use Back Gate only (Kennedy St Entrance)
 NO FREE PASSES ALLOCATED AT GATES. ALL NON-MEMBER COMPETITORS MUST PAY
 AT GATE.
- 4. Damage Through Exhibits: The society will not be responsible for any accident that may be caused through or by any exhibit, and it shall be a condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold the Society blameless and indemnified against any Legal proceedings arising from such accidents.
- 5. Accidents: The Society will not, under any circumstances, hold itself liable for any accident on the grounds or premises.
- 6. Damage to Exhibits: The Society will not, under any circumstances, hold itself responsible for any loss or damage to, or miss-delivery of exhibits.
- 7. Loss by Disease: Monto Show Society has endorsed a biosecurity plan and all plant and animal donors and exhibitors are required to comply with the plan and complete any relevant Health Declarations prior to entry
- 8. Fire: Precautions will be taken to guard against fire and to protect the property at the exhibition, but exhibits will not be insured at the cost of the Society.
- 9. Exhibits entered in the wrong class by the exhibitor may be transferred to the proper class by the Stewards at the discretion of the Judge.
- 10. The Society may receive for exhibition only (not for competition) any exhibits not specified in the schedule, providing there be sufficient space. The Society reserves the right to refuse any entry without giving reasons for so doing.
- 11. Exhibitors, if called upon by the Committee, shall prove the correctness of their certificates of entry by statutory declaration or otherwise.
- 12. Responsibility for accuracy of pedigrees and of any other particulars required by prize schedule conditions rests solely with exhibitors. Incorrect particulars or omission of particulars required may render the competitor liable to forfeiture of prize money won, and to disqualification for such period as the Committee may deem fitting.
- 13. Should there be any reason to suspect that any exhibit is either dangerous or diseased, the Committee reserves the right of refusing admittance to or of removing same from the around at the expense of the exhibitor.
- 14. All exhibits must be delivered to and from the grounds at the risk of the exhibitor.
- 15. All exhibits must be on the grounds at the time stated in the schedule, or if not stated, then not later than 9am on Judging Day.
- 16. Unless more than two entries are received in a Class, the Society reserves the right to reduce first prize by 30% and award a ribbon only for second.
- 17. The Judge may award certificates of merit to exhibits, vis., "Highly Commended" or "Commended" if warranted.
- 18. No entry will be received from any person disqualified by the Queensland Chamber of Agricultural Societies or any of the leading Race Clubs during the

period of such disqualification. Should any such entry be accidentally accepted, it shall, whenever discovered, be deemed void, and the entry fee will be forfeited.

- 19. No entries will be received except on the conditions that all disputes, objections, and protests shall be decided by the committee of the Society (or majority of those present) whose decision shall be final.
- 20. No protest will be considered unless lodged with the Secretary in writing before 6pm on the day of the competition, enclosing \$20, which will be forfeited to the Society's funds should the protest be considered frivolous. Protests will only be received from competitors in Class questioned.
- 21. As soon as the Judges have made their award in any Class the prize exhibit shall be distinguished by different coloured ribbons or cards: Blue first, Red second, Yellow third, White special, Purple champion and Green reserve champion.
- 22. The age of all cattle shall be computed as from the first of April. In the event of any dispute age will be determined by the tooth test. Stud animals entered in Herd Books will be taken at actual age.
- 23. Any person being a nuisance or using insulting language or behaviour will be expelled from the grounds.
- 24. All exhibits must remain on the Show grounds until 3pm on the last day of the Show. No exhibit will be allowed to be removed without the sanction of the Secretary or Stewards. In cases of a breach of this rule, all prizes that have been awarded to the exhibitor may be forfeited unless satisfactory reason is given.
- 25. Prize money unclaimed and outstanding for 30 days, will be forfeited to the Society.
- 26. In case any dispute may arise as to the construction to be put upon any of the By-Laws and Regulations the same shall be determined by the Committee of the Society whose decision shall be final.
- 27. Auctioneers shall pay to the Society a commission not less than two and one half percent upon livestock sale effected on the Show Grounds, whether by auction or by private contract.
- 28. No responsibility to local exhibitors for exhibits not collected at Show.
- 29. Stewards shall remove exhibitors and other persons from the vicinity of the Judges while judging is in progress.
- 30. Judges are expected to attend at the Secretary's office on the Show grounds at the hour appointed and introduce themselves to the Secretary and to the Stewards of the Section.
- 31. Judges will receive Award Books from Stewards of the Section.
- 32. Judges as they arrive at their decisions will write their award with any remarks they may desire in the Award Book.
- 33. Judges shall disqualify any exhibitor who, in their opinion, does not comply with the regulations, and shall enter the reason in their book.
- 34. Judges may recommend for certificates or commend as they think fit, any exhibit of special merit not included in the Schedule of prizes, and need not award prizes in any class in which exhibits are considered, in their opinion of sufficient merit.
- 35. Judges will sign the Award Book, and deliver them to the Stewards of the Section.

SECTION 1 - HORSE EVENTS

SPECIAL REGULATIONS:

- All persons in charge of horses or ponies on the show grounds must supply the Society with a copy of their Horse Health Declaration and Waiver complete with description of animal as well as the name and address of responsible person before competing in any event at this show.
- 2. Horses and Ponies in stud led-in classes must produce certificate of registration when requested by Chief Steward, also Horses competing in ASH Society Events MUST produce financial Membership Cards before competing in events. (There will be NO EXCEPTION to this rule).
- 3. Heavyweight Hacks cannot compete in Lightweight classes or vise versa. All are eligible to compete in Ladies or Gents classes.
- 4. All prize winners are eligible to compete for championship without special entry.
- 5. No stallion will be allowed to compete in classes for hacks.
- 6. Short definitions: Pony a pony must not exceed 14 hands. Miniature Horses & Ponies are not permitted to compete in the Open Pony Classes as well as Miniature Classes. Galloway must be over 14 and not exceed 15 hands true to Galloway type and conformation. All animals above 15hh must compete in open classes.
- 7. No horses or ponies will be allowed to come into the ring with ribbons on, except in parade.
- 8. Additional events may be run at the discretion of the Stewards.
- 9. Loan horses must be pastured in the Shire at least three months prior to the Show.
- 10. District events include North Burnett Regional Council and Banana Shire.
- 11. Local Rider Classes restricted to the area within 60 kms of Monto or members of Monto Pony Club.
- 12. All led classes must produce papers on request of the steward.
- 13. NOVICE For horses that have never won a Championship Hack at an Agricultural Show or a first at a Royal Show.
- 14. In the event of two events clashing the competitor/s must decide in which event to compete as no events will be delayed.
- 15. Online Entries and payments accepted until midnight, this is the preferred method of entry. Please remember to complete Horse Health Declaration and Waiver forms at the Main show Office on morning of event.
- 16. Late entries accepted on the day of competition at the Main Show Office,
- 17. For those who are GST registered, prizemoney will be paid by cheque upon receipt of a GST Invoice at the Main Secretary's Office on completion of all events.

RULES FOR DRY WORK Saturday 8am – Judges Address Rodeo Arena

- 1. This section is to show the control, calmness and athletic ability of the horse.
- 2. The section will be scored out of 100 points, using the score breakdown included with the pattern.
- 3. Credit points will be awarded for the following
 - a. Executing the pattern with a higher degree of difficulty
 - b. Using the full working area and using the centre as marked by the markers
 - c. Making the speed and size of the circles exactly as they are marked on the pattern
 - d. Strong stops and smooth rollbacks
 - e. Overall continuity, smoothness and correctness
 - f. Overall impression of the pattern
 - 4. 20 Point Penalty. Any MAJOR deviation, omission or addition to the prescribed pattern will incur a '0' score for that manoeuvre plus a 20 point penalty. More than one major deviation will incur a '0' for the entire pattern.



RULES FOR CATTLE WORK Sunday morning after completion of Campdraft - Main Arena


- 1. The course will consist of 2 pegs and a single gate peg, option to go left or right. 25 pts for cut out, 25 pts for first and second circles, 25 pts for third circle, Total 100pts.
- 2. If a competitor loses a beast to the back of the camp, they shall steady and walk back into the cattle to work that beast clear. If a beast is lost back a second time, the cut-out is terminated. The committee will remove the beast through the gates and the competitor will continue the run outside on that beast.
- 3. Competitor will cease run when the judge or timer (40 seconds) terminates run.
- 4. Judge may award another beast if the selected beast escapes from the camp. Any reruns will be on original score. Once the beast has cleared the camp there will be no reruns.
- 5. Judge may terminate a run if it is deemed the run is endangering the beast or the rider, and score accordingly.
- 6. Every competitor will receive a score.
- 7. The Committee is concerned with the welfare of the cattle and therefore will be enforcing the following rule: There will be a line in the camp. You must be at a walk when your cross this line at all times or you will be cracked off.



SECTION 2 - COMMERCIAL CATTLE & CARCASS

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY:

- 1. All cattle must be fitted with a NLIS tag and be on the grounds by 5pm on April 21st 2023. Feeding in yards not permitted
- 2. Judging will commence Saturday following the conclusion of Led Steers & Heifers
- 3. The Society will take no responsibility other than the feeding and watering of cattle on the grounds till 3pm last day of Show
- 4. Owners to assist with sorting & penning as directed by the Chief Steward
- 5. All cattle must be the bona fide property of the exhibitor for three months prior to the Show. All cattle are received subject to the right of the Stewards to reject any cattle not up to the Show standard and, if required, to arrange for same to be removed from the grounds before judging commences
- 6. Stewards have the right to transfer any entry to a more suitable class
- 7. All cattle must be effectively dehorned or tipped and of suitable temperament. Wild cattle may be removed from the grounds at the discretion of the Stewards
- 8. Cattle cannot compete in more than one class excepting the carcass classes. A freshly erupted or lost tooth shall be counted
- 9. Champions may be selected from a pen or single classes
- 10. Commercial cattle will require a Nomination Form or Vendor Dec in order to cover movements to and from the showgrounds. NLIS movements will be a sighted transfer for cattle returning to home property
- 11. No cattle will be accepted as non-competitive
- 12. All exhibitors & the public must remain outside the yards while judging is in progress
- 13. Breed of cattle to be stated on entry form
- 14. Classes 207, 212, 220, 221, 222 and 223 must be pasture or crop fed. Not grain assisted
- 15. Cattle entered in Commercial Beef Section to remain in cattle yards until the conclusion of the Young Judges Stud Cattle judging on Sunday afternoon
- 16. Cattle must be free of ticks and must meet DPI and animal welfare standards
- 17. In all pen classes, at least one beast must have stated number of teeth, others may have less
- 18. Cattle must be off properties with a JBAS 6 or Higher—please be aware that cattle in Single Beast Classes are penned together. Please be aware that cattle are penned next to other cattle and can have nose to nose contact
- 19. All cattle will be weighed and mouthed on Friday afternoon during processing
