North Burnett Regional Council Amending Subordinate Local Law No.2 (Animal Management) 2024

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Part 1 Preliminary

1 Short title

This local law may be cited as Local Law (Amending) Subordinate Local Law No. 2 (Animal Management) 2024.

2. Commencement

This local law commences on the date notice of the making of the local law is published in the gazette.

3. Local law amended

This local law amends Subordinate Local Law No. 2 (Animal Management) 2011.

Part 2 Amendment of Subordinate Local Law No. 2 (Animal Management) 2011

4. Amendment to s4 (Definitions)

' amending authorising local law means amending local law No.2 (Animal Management).'.

5. Insertion of new s 8A (Identification for cats and dogs in certain circumstances – Authorising local law s 9)

After section 8 -

- '8A Identification for cats and dogs in certain circumstances Authorising local law, s9
 - (1) For section 9 of the authorising local law, the identification required for an animal that is at a

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place other than the address stated in the registration for the animal is—

- (a) for a cat or dog that is required under the Animal Management (Cats and Dogs) Act 2008 to be implanted with a permanent identification device—the permanent identification device; or
- (b) for another cat or dog—the registration device mentioned in section 12 of the *Animal Management (Cats and Dogs) Act 2008.*'.

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6. Omission of s 9A (Dog off leash areas – Authorising local law, s11(1)) –

7. Insertion of new s 13A (Place of care for impounded animals – Authorising local law s 24) –

13A Place of care for impounded animals—Authorising local law, s 24

For section 24 of the authorising local law, the place of care for animals impounded by the local government will be operated by the local government or in the alternative, a duly registered place of care as nominated by the local government.

Example of place of care -

RSPCA, veterinary surgeon. dog kennels, another local government facility.'.

A prohibition prescribed in this schedule does not apply to the keeping of an animal or animals on premises if –

- (a) the animal or animals were kept on the premises before the commencement of the amending authorising local law; and
- (b) the keeping of the animal or animals on the premises immediately before the commencement of the amending authorising local law did not contravene any provision of a local law of the local government that was repealed contemporaneously with the making of the amending authorising local law.
- (c) This exemption does not extend to the keeping of any animal or animals on the premises that have been introduced, substituted for or replaced an animal or animals being kept on the premises after the commencement of the amending authorising local law beyond the number of animals as prescribed.

An Urban Area includes the land identified in the Queensland Government Publication 'Defined Urban Areas'.

¹ Under section 6(3) of the authorising local law, an approval is not required for the keeping of animals on land if the keeping of the animals on the land is an existing lawful use under section 260 of the *Planning Act 2016*.
